



DuPont Basic Solid Surface RoHS/RoHS2 COMPLIANCE DECLARATION

Directive EU RoHS 2002/95/EC on the Restriction of the Use of Certain Hazardous Substances in Electrical and Electronic Equipment (RoHS) Directive was passed into law in 2006. Under this directive the use of lead, mercury, cadmium, hexavalent chromium, polybrominated biphenyls (PBBs) and polybrominated diphenyl ether (PBDEs) flame retardants is restricted in the manufacture of electrical and electronic equipment with the exception of the items listed in the Annex of the Directive.

In 2011, an updated RoHS Directive, Directive 2011/65/EU on Restrictions of Hazardous Substances, on the restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment (recast) added new categories to the list of affected products. The new directive, also known as RoHS2 or RoHS Recast became law on January 2, 2013. RoHS2 Directive does not restrict additional substances and the restricted levels of the existing substances did not change.

DuPont Basic solid surfacing products do not contain restricted substances listed in Directive 2011/65/EU.
